Policy on Name Reservations

The Republican Coalition, Inc. was established as a parent organization for state and local affiliated organizations of like-minded Republicans who want to focus on conservative policy initiatives. It was started after the successful launch of the Cherokee County Republican Coalition, Inc. We enjoyed positive feedback from local Republicans looking for an environment to discuss policy, while at the same time, work with local and state leaders to advance conservative ideas. We are not a political party, and no elected official is involved in or directing our decisions.

Since the formation of the Cherokee County chapter, there have been other Republicans in other parts of the state who have expressed an interest in starting their own local chapters.

On Thursday June 15, 2023, The Republican Coalition became aware the name "Cobb County Republican Coalition" had been reserved with the Georgia Secretary of State. The records of the Secretary of State's office show that the Chairwoman of the Cobb County Republican Party, Salleigh Grubbs, filed and reserved the name. Ms. Grubbs has no affiliation with CCRC, and she was not authorized to use the "Republican Coalition" name. This name reservation causes The Republican Coalition grave concern in that other entities may purport to be affiliates of The Republican Coalition when they are not authorized to do so.

As a result of these developments, The Republican Coalition secured the naming rights for affiliated organizations in the counties with the largest number of registered voters and certain other counties in Georgia. As new chapters come online, The Republican Coalition will announce them publicly.



CCRC May Breakfast Event

Our first event since launch was a Saturday breakfast held at Guston's Grille in Woodstock on 3 June. The event was a moderated town-hall led by CCRC Chair Rajpal Sagoo and focused on Cherokee Safety and featuring Solicitor Todd Hayes, Sheriff Frank Reynolds, and District Attorney Susan Treadaway.

For a first event, it was simply a resounding success with 60 in attendance. As usual, Guston's provided great service and a fantastic breakfast buffet.
